PARTNERSHIP TO CREATE A DEMENTIA INCLUSIVE GENERATION



This Transition Year (TY)
programme, combines Saint
Joseph's in-person TY
information and awareness
session with the *Creating a Dementia Inclusive Generation*online e-learning course codesigned by The Alzheimer
Society of Ireland (ASI) and DSIDC
(Dementia Services Information
and Development Centre).





How it works

- Part 1: Two School Ambassadors from Saint Joseph's Shankill will visit your school to provide a one-hour talk about dementia, its impact, and how Saint Joseph's has adopted a dementia-specific household model of care focusing on people's emotional well-being.
- Part 2: Then students complete the 5 module online e-learning course co-developed by the ASI and the DSIDC:
 - Growing Older
 - About the Brain
 - A Healthy Brain
 - What is Dementia
 - Perceptions of Dementia

It is recommended that the e-learning course be completed during school hours to promote discussion and engagement. Your students will receive a Certificate of Completion, which will enable them to become peer-to-peer educators to deliver a series of educational lessons within your school.

Both Saint Joseph's Shankill and The Alzheimer Society of Ireland programmes are official Challenge Partners with *An Gaisce The President's Award*, so students can avail of the opportunity to fulfil *Gaisce* challenge area requirements.
